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Headmaster's Welcome

Welcome to the 2009/10 Ashtedian. This edition reflects the many achievements and activities of pupils at Freeman's during the academic year. Even in such a large publication as this, it is impossible to include absolutely everything which takes place at our busy School. However, I hope the pages following cover the highlights.

Public examination results for 2010 matched the record results of 2009. At GCSE more than four fifths of the grades were either A* or A, and at A Level 89% of the grades were A*, A or B. In 2010 a new A* grade was introduced at A Level and over 26% of grades at CLFS were the new A* grade, against a national average of 8%. At Freeman's the pupils and their teachers are able to achieve these superb results alongside a plethora of other activities and achievements reflected in this magazine.

The PE and Games Department had their usual busy seasons in the different sports and, as ever, Freeman's pupils were impressive ambassadors for the School off the pitch – always seeking to give of their best even against some very tough opposition. Much of the year was spent preparing for the New Zealand rugby tour in July 2010.

Music and Drama thrived as ever throughout the year. We all enjoyed the major performance in the Autumn Term of *Sweeney Todd* and in the Spring Term, Class Act 2 at Dorking Halls was a showcase for the increasing numbers of musicians of all ages at Freeman's. In the Summer Term the Junior/Senior School production of *Smile!* was a memorable reminder of Victorian school days based on Dotheboys Hall.

The Drama Department also performed a piece on the Net Generation for the Consumer Goods Forum Global Summit, courtesy of one of our parents, and towards the end of the year began preparations for the Edinburgh Festival production. The confidence of our pupils on the sports field, on the stage and in concerts is also the hallmark of the Debating Society which had another successful year.

The Young Enterprise Scheme and the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme were both very busy during the year with D of E expeditions at Bronze, Silver and Gold level throughout the year.

The culmination of the Art Department's work throughout the year is the excellent GCSE and A Level display of students' work and the parents who attended the exhibition commented on the very high standards of the Department.

The annual Prize Day towards the end of the Summer Term gave us all the opportunity to celebrate these and many other successes during the academic year.

In the summer holidays in 2010 a number of major overseas trips took place. The New Zealand rugby tour was one of the largest organised by the School with two teams and several staff travelling the length and breadth of New Zealand. The First Team won all of their fixtures and the Seconds won the majority of theirs. An expedition to Peru, the preparations for which had been in place for over a year, gave a large group of Freeman's pupils the chance to see much of the natural beauty of the country and to get involved in community projects there. The biennial drama production for the Edinburgh

Fringe took place in August to sell out audiences and with very favourable reviews. The production, *The Typhoid Marys*, was written by the Head of Drama himself.

I have been particularly impressed with the commitment of pupils to the service of others and the very enjoyable Raise Awareness and Give (RAG) week in the Spring Term gave scope to the creative talents of many of our Sixth Form as well as their ability to cajole members of staff to assist them.

I would like to thank everyone who has provided articles and photographs for this edition of the Ashtedian, pupils and staff and finally, I would like to thank Mr Mike Holland for editing the Ashtedian once more and liaising with patience and skill with the designers and printers to produce this fine 2009/10 edition.
